The following investigation was conducted concerning the City of Columbus' 2021 annual objection to the renewal of liquor permit 84189940430 issued to Speedway LLC, which is doing business as Speedway #1216 located at 6175 E. Livingston Avenue, Columbus, Ohio 43232.

After reviewing the State of Ohio, Franklin County, and City of Columbus records regarding the above liquor permit establishment, the following information has been compiled to support the objection to the renewal of the aforementioned permit issued by the State of Ohio.

The above listed liquor establishment has been issued a **C1**, **C2**, and **D6** permits by the Division of Liquor. This permit grants the permit holder the privilege to sell alcoholic beverages at the above listed address.

A review of the Columbus Division of Police records revealed the Division of Police has created (35) thirty-five official police reports concerning incidents at the listed liquor establishment between January 2020 and November 2021. These reports referenced homicide, discharging firearms, robbery, weapons offenses, rape/sexual assault, menacing, assaults, kidnapping, intoxicated individuals needing assistance, and motor vehicle theft, including:

In addition, the Columbus Division of Police have been dispatched to 6175 E. Livingston Avenue, Columbus, Ohio 43232 on (298) two hundred ninety-eight calls for service, (128) one hundred and ninety-eight in 2020, and (170) one hundred seventy in 2021 at Speedway. These calls for service include responses to shootings, persons with a gun or knife, robberies, assaults, fights, domestic violence, prostitution, overdoses, narcotics complaints, intoxicated individuals needing assistance, arrest of wanted persons, disturbances (including disturbances with a high risk of violence and disturbances involving intoxicated individuals and open containers), trespassing, motor vehicle thefts, O.V.I.'s, and property destruction.

The Columbus Division of Fire was also dispatched to the location (46) forty-six times from October 2020 through October 2021, including for (11) eleven overdoses.
