This ordinance accepts the collective bargaining agreement between the City of Columbus and the Communication Workers of America, Local 4502 covering the period of April 24, 2023 through April 23, 2026.

All Articles of this agreement and attachments thereto have been approved by the City and the Union. A signed agreement will be on file in the Department of Human Resources.

Emergency action is recommended because the collective bargaining agreement expired on April 23, 2023.

The fiscal impact is summarized in a memorandum to City Council, dated June 30, 2023.

To accept the proposed collective bargaining agreement between the City of Columbus and the Communication Workers of America, Local 4502, April 24, 2023 through April 23, 2026, to provide wages, hours and other terms and conditions of employment for employees in the bargaining unit as provided in the attachment hereto; and to declare an emergency.

WHEREAS, a collective bargaining agreement has been reached between the City of Columbus and the Communication Workers of America, Local 4502 covering the period of April 24, 2023 through April 23, 2026 which has been approved by the City and the Union; and

WHEREAS, a copy of the agreement has been submitted to the Council and a signed copy will be on file in the Department of Human Resources; and

WHEREAS, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Department of Human Resources in that it is

immediately necessary to approve the collective bargaining agreement negotiated between the City of Columbus and the Communication Workers of America, Local 4502, April 24, 2023 through April 23, 2026, in order to effectuate the timely, negotiated clauses, thereby preserving the public peace, property, health, safety, and welfare; **NOW, THEREFORE,**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

SECTION 1. The Council of the City of Columbus hereby accepts the proposed collective bargaining agreement between the City and the Communication Workers of America, Local 4502, attached hereto and incorporated herein in its entirety as if fully rewritten herein, to establish wages, hours and other terms and conditions of employment for employees in the bargaining unit, as specified and stated in the attachment hereto. A copy of the attachment will be kept on file in the Office of the City Clerk and the Department of Human Resources and will not be printed in the City Bulletin as a part thereof.

SECTION 2. If any section of this Ordinance, including any article, section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of the attachment hereto, for any reason, is held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions or sections of this ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed the ordinance, and each section hereof, including any article, section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of the attachment hereto, irrespective of the fact that any one or more articles, sections, subsections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses or phrases may be declared unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor, or ten (10) days after passage if the Mayor neither approves nor vetoes the same.
