**WHEREAS**, we celebrate the progress that women have made while remaining vigilant of the areas in which progress can and should be made; and

**WHEREAS**, women’s access to education, health care and paid labor has improved, and legislation promising equal opportunities for women and respect for their human rights has been adopted in many countries; and

**WHEREAS**, we cannot rest, however, until our mothers, sisters and daughters secure their rightful place as full and equal partners in a just, peaceful and civil society at home and abroad; and

**WHEREAS**, the Center for Women’s Advancement, Inc. serves Somali women and girls in the United States and the Horn of Africa, providing the tools needed to build secure and positive lives and healthy relationships at all levels of society; and

**WHEREAS**, we observe International Women’s Day to recognize the social, economic and political barriers that have been overcome, address those that persist, and continue to work toward the day when women’s equality has been fully realized,

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:**

That this Council celebrates the vital role that women have played throughout history and remains fully committed to a world in which women's equality is no longer a goal but a reality, and does hereby declare March 8, 2015, to be International Women's Day in Columbus.
