The City of Columbus, Ohio ("City") holds title to a general utility easement as reserved in Instrument № 200803240044183, Recorder's Office, Franklin County, Ohio. The City of Columbus, Ohio, previously released its reserved water line easement rights in a Release of Easements, Instrument № 201110130130736, Recorder's Office, Franklin County, Ohio. Morse Holding Co., a Delaware corporation, now request for the remaining general utility easement rights be released in exchange for the replacement sanitary, storm, and water line easements given to the City, and recorded as Instrument Nos 201101100004970, 201101100004972, and 201101100004974, Recorder's Office, Franklin County, Ohio. The Department of Public Utilities reviewed, approved, and determined that the release of the remaining general utility easement rights described below will not adversely affect the City and should be granted. The following legislation authorizes the Director of the Department of Public Utilities to execute those documents necessary to release the City's right into the real property more fully described in the body of this ordinance.

Whereas, the City of Columbus, Ohio, previously released its reserved water line easement rights in a Release of Easements, Instrument № 201110130130736, Recorder's Office, Franklin County, Ohio; and

Whereas, Morse Holding Co., a Delaware corporation, now request for the remaining general utility easement rights be released in exchange for the replacement sanitary, storm, and water line easements given to the City of Columbus, Ohio, and recorded as Instrument Nos 201101100004970, 201101100004972, and 201101100004974, Recorder's Office, Franklin County, Ohio; and

Whereas, the Department of Public Utilities reviewed, approved, and determined that the release of the remaining general utility easement rights described below will not adversely affect the City of Columbus, Ohio; now, therefore:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

Section 1. That the Director of the Department of Public Utilities be, and hereby is authorized to execute those documents, prepared by the Department of Law, Real Estate Division, necessary to release to Morso Holding Co., a Delaware corporation, its remaining general utility easement rights granted in the following easement of record in Official Records, Recorded in the Recorder's Office, Franklin County, Ohio, to wit:
