**WHEREAS**, William W. Williams served his country with valor, receiving the Purple Heart, a decoration awarded to members of the armed forces of the U.S. who are wounded by an instrument of war in the hands of the enemy; and

**WHEREAS**, William W. Williams, a humble man of heroic stature, will be greatly missed by his wife Mary Elizabeth, daughter Libby, son Klaus, brother and sister-in-laws, nieces, nephews, grandchildren and friends; now, therefore
