WHEREAS, a Capital Improvements Budget for the year 2007 has been adopted by Council under a separate ordinance; Now Therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

SECTION 1. That the Capital Improvements Program for the years 2007 - 2012 described herein is hereby accepted as the primary guide for the consideration and adoption of the 2007 Capital Improvements Budget ordinance.

SECTION 2. That this resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
