COLUMBUS CONTRACTOR COMPANY, by JOHN J. GIRARD, President, has submitted the plat titled GATES OF McNAUGHTEN to the City Engineer's Office for review and approval. This plat has been reviewed and approved by the City Engineer. The following legislation allows the City to accept said plat for property located off of McNaughten Road south of East Broad Street.

To accept the plat titled GATES OF McNAUGHTEN, from COLUMBUS CONTRACTOR COMPANY, by JOHN J. GIRARD, President **and to declare an emergency.**

WHEREAS, the plat titled GATES OF McNAUGHTEN (hereinafter "plat"), has been submitted to the City Engineer's Office for approval and acceptance; and

WHEREAS, COLUMBUS CONTRACTOR COMPANY, by JOHN J. GIRARD, President, owner of the platted land, desires to dedicate to the public use all or such parts of the Lane and Road shown on said plat and not heretofore so dedicated; and

WHEREAS, after examination, it has been found to be in the best interest of the City to accept said plat and; ~~now, therefore~~

WHEREAS, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Department of Public Service in that it is immediately necessary to pass this ordinance as an emergency measure because of the need to work within weather constraints, therefore meeting homeowners' demand for this patio home development for the preservation of the public health, peace, property, safety, and welfare; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

Section 1. That the plat titled GATES OF McNAUGHTEN on file in the office of the City Engineer, Transportation Division, be and the same is hereby accepted.

Section 2. ~~That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.~~

That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor, or ten days after passage if the Mayor neither approves nor vetoes the same.
