VHEREAS, research from the University ofMichigan has shownthatrecordsealing improvesearnings and lowers the chanceofre-arrest; nd

VHEREAS, Opportunity Portbegan asaColumbusCity Council criminaljustice initiative, was awardedfundingby SchmidtFutures, and roved to the Drug Enforcement and Policy Center in July 2021 where it continued to develop; and

VHEREAS, Opportunity Port's legal service providers are the Drug Enforcement and Policy Center, the Legal Aid Society ofColumbus, quality Ohio, and the Franklin County Municipal CourtSelfHelp Center, whotogether assisted 527 Columbus residents with completing nd filing record sealing and expungement applications to Franklin County courts; and

VHEREAS, Opportunity Portcontinues to build on its success and has recently launched services statewide to provide record sealing and xpungement application assistance to all justice involved residents of Ohio who are seeking relief from their criminal record; and
