WHEREAS, Jerome graduated from LaBrae High School in 1981. He attended the University of Toledo on a full Football scholarship from 1981-1986. Jerome graduated with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Criminal Justice; and

WHEREAS, Jerome has also worked undercover assignments in conjunction with Ohio Liquor Agents throughout the city of Columbus. Officer Stephens has worked for the last twenty two years on the Mayor's Protection Detail. Jerome served under Mayor Greg Lashutka, Mayor Michael B. Coleman, and Mayor Andrew J. Ginther; and

WHEREAS, during his career Officer Stephens was awarded Police Officer of the Month in 1996 and a Chief's Letter of Commendation for the felony arrest of a rape suspect in 1998; and

WHEREAS, Officer Stephens will retire from the Columbus Division of Police on February 1, 2021. He will retire with more than 31 years of exceptional service to the Division and to the citizens of Columbus. Jerome's wife Officer April Stephens, will join him in retirement in March of 2021.
