



## Legislation Text

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### **1. BACKGROUND**

Havery Run, LLC, David Ruma, owner of the platted land, has submitted the plat titled "Basinghall Road Dedication" to the City Engineer's Office for review and approval. This plat has been reviewed and approved by the City Engineer. This ordinance authorizes the City to accept said plat for property located North of Riggins Road and East of Avery Road.

### **2. FISCAL IMPACT**

There is no fiscal impact to the City to accept the plat.

### **3. EMERGENCY DESIGNATION**

Emergency action is requested to allow development of this roadway to proceed as currently scheduled.

To accept the plat titled "Basinghall Road Dedication" from Havery Run, LLC, for property located North of Riggins Road and East of Avery Road; and to declare an emergency. (\$0.00)

**WHEREAS**, the plat titled "Basinghall Road Dedication" (hereinafter "plat") has been submitted to the City Engineer's Office for approval and acceptance; and

**WHEREAS**, Havery Run, LLC, David Ruma, owner of the platted land, desires to dedicate to the public use all or such all of Basinghall Road and easements shown on said plat and not heretofore so dedicated; and

**WHEREAS**, after examination, it has been found to be in the best interest of the City to accept said plat; and

**WHEREAS**, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Department of Public Service in that it is immediately necessary to authorize the acceptance of this plat so development of this road can proceed as currently scheduled, thereby preserving the public health, peace, property, safety and welfare; **now, therefore**

### **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:**

**SECTION 1.** That the plat titled "Basinghall Road Dedication" on file in the office of the City Engineer, Division of Infrastructure Management, be and the same is hereby accepted.

**SECTION 2.** That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor or ten days after passage if the Mayor neither approves nor vetoes the same.
