**BACKGROUND:** The City’s Department of Public Service (“DPS”) is performing CelebrateOne Sidewalk project (“Public Project”). The City must acquire certain fee simple title and lesser real estate located citywide (collectively, “Real Estate”) in order for DPS to timely complete the Public Project. The City passed Ordinance Number 2837-2018 authorizing the City Attorney to acquire the Real Estate. Accordingly, the City intends to appropriate and accept the Real Estate in the event the City Attorney is unable to (i) locate the owners of the Real Estate, or (ii) agree with the owners of the Real Estate in good faith regarding the amount of just compensation.

To declare the City’s necessity and intent to appropriate and accept certain fee simple title and lesser real estate in order to complete the CelebrateOne Sidewalk project. (\$0.00)

**WHEREAS,** the City intends to improve certain public right-of-way by allowing the Department of Public Service (“DPS”) to engage in the CelebrateOne Sidewalk project (“Public Project”); and

**WHEREAS,** the City intends for the City Attorney to acquire the necessary fee simple title and lesser real estate located citywide (“Real Estate”) in order to complete the Public Project; and

**WHEREAS,** the City intends for the Real Estate’s acquisition to help make, improve, or repair certain portions of public right-of-way and associated appurtenances which will be open to the public without charge; and

**WHEREAS,** the City intends to appropriate and accept the Real Estate in the event the City Attorney is unable to (i) locate the owners of the Real Estate, or (ii) agree with the owners of the Real Estate in good faith regarding the amount of just compensation; and **now, therefore:**

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:**

**SECTION 1.** That the City, pursuant to the City’s Charter, Columbus City Revised Code, Chapter 909 (1959), Constitution of the state of Ohio, and Ohio Revised Code, Chapter 719, declares the necessity and intent to appropriate and accept the fee simple title and lesser real estate to the following listed parcels (“Real Estate”), which are fully described in their associated exhibits and incorporated into this resolution for reference, in order for the Department of Public Service (“DPS”) to complete the CelebrateOne Sidewalk project (“Public Project”).
